Outstanding Clinical Training

Residency training in Anesthesiology at UCLA is a four-year program. Each resident begins as an intern (PGY-1) during our tailored Clinical Base Year, followed by three years at the Ronald Reagan UCLA Medical Center (RRUMC) and affiliated sites, including Olive View Medical Center, Children's Hospital Los Angeles, Long Beach Memorial Medical Center, and the Veteran's Administration Greater Los Angeles Medical Center.



Research

Outstanding basic science and clinical research is available to all residents. Competitive advanced research pathways and stipends available (ARRP & ASRP). Presentations are funded annually at the Western Anesthesia Residents Conference, the American Society of Anesthesiologists Meeting, and various subspecialty conferences.
